# **Pace's Pilgrimage**



August is always such a wonderful month of "starting" things. I remember in my football days, we always jumped into the "two-a-day" practices in the hot August sun preparing for the start of the season. Of course, the start of the new school year is always in August in these parts. And for us in the Church, even though we aren't "starting" a new liturgical season, we generally follow these patterns and act like we are with new vigor in our worship, attendance, Christian formation, etc.

And this is not a bad thing! I am excited about the things we are going to start in August. Rally Day is going to be on Sunday, August 27. The Vestry has a "Rally Day Committee" this year that has been planning the details of this event for a couple of months now. It

will be a true "Ministry Fair." I love the idea that we will "start" our fall with an emphasis on our ministries.

But I also want to "start" another new practice on that same Sunday. One of the most important things to the way we worship in the Episcopal Church is that the Holy Eucharist is a single, complete service of the whole. It is meant to be a service where we are first nurtured in mind, body, and spirit with God's Holy Word through the reading of the Scriptures, the preaching of the word, and the proclaiming of the Prayers. Then, having been "nourished" by the Word, we share the Peace of God with each other, and come together as one in the breaking of bread and drinking of the cup. That Service of the Table then sends us into the world, ready to be the Body of Christ for all. However, currently, this flow is interrupted by a "halftime" of non-worship "announcements."

Therefore, beginning August 27 at all services, Welcoming and Announcements will occur before the Prelude and Opening Hymn. What I like about this is that it is also hospitable and welcoming to visitors and newcomers. I can welcome them "at the start of the service." And when I have made the general announcements, pointing to the Angel's Alert newsletter, I can say: "Let us now prepare to worship the Lord." Which will be the signal for us all to move into a place of prayerful silence as the organ begins the prelude (or the bell choir begins, or the choir starts an introit). Then, we will start the Opening Procession and begin the service.

I plan that we will still have the blessings (Anniversary, Birthday, and Children's) right after the Peace, as these are all clearly part of worship. But after the blessing, the celebrant will immediately give the invitation to communion and the "Offertory Sentence" and begin the preparation for Communion.

I am excited about the wonderful possibilities of our continued joyous worship together. May God always bless our journey.

This Children/Youth Task Force has spent the past couple of months identifying values, strengths, needs and goals in an effort to establish a comprehensive program that will help our children and youth become more formed and firm in their faith and our community. As a committee, we seek to provide a variety of worship experiences. Experiences that will help young people connect with God, with one another, and with those of us that are now further down our walks with Christ.



As part of this discernment, we will be seeking input from parishioners-adults,

children, and youth—about our ministry to our children and youth. We will be sending out surveys and talking with parishioners in person. We look forward to and appreciate your feedback.

## A NOTE FROM THE JUNIOR WARDEN

Fellow Parishioners,

You might have noticed that our chandeliers and wall sconces in the Nave are ablaze with new low wattage, energy efficient LED bulbs.

Because of the success of this conversion to new lighting technology, the ceiling lights will be replaced in August. The new light fixtures will also be of "green friendly" LED technology and will significantly reduce our energy consumption. The expected longevity of these lights (22years) will hopefully prevent the replacement of the incandecsent bulbs in the nave as we did 5 years ago.

Through the use of new man-lifting equipment that is now available, we will be able to reach the fixtures above the choir risers without the need for costly scaffolding.

As an added benefit, Xcel Energy will provide a rebate for these new fixtures which will defray some of the cost.
