PACE'S Passage

This April brings us such a time of hope and energy in our parish. We begin the month halfway through our Lenten journeys. I have been so pleased with the overall intentionality that I have seen in our congregation to the process of having a Holy Lent. Our Wednesday night Lenten Series, focused on the Way of Love, is brimming with people of all ages. If you haven't come, I encourage you to try one of the last couple of Wednesday evenings left in Lent (4/3 or 4/10).

But April will soon move us into the most sacred experience in our church--Holy Week. I'd like to highlight some of the things we are going to get to look forward to that week.

First, we'll glimpse the coming drama of our Lord's passion narrative on Palm Sunday, which is April 14. This is such a powerful Sunday, where we celebrate with waving palms, we hear the Gospel narrative read by multiple voices, and we feel that we are there with Jesus as he heads to the cross.

Afterward, we move into Holy Week proper. We should all prepare ourselves to be in the presence of God and to experience God's grace in the liturgy and with each other throughout this most Holy of weeks. On Monday and Tuesday (4/15 & 4/16), we have the opportunity to attend Evening Prayer in the Children's Chapel each day at 5:30 PM. Then on Wednesday (4/17), we can participate in the liturgy of Holy Eucharist with Unction, also at 5:30 in the Children's Chapel.

Beginning Thursday (4/18) of Holy Week, we begin what is known is Latin as the "Paschal Triduum"--which means the "Easter Period of Three Days." We start that Thursday night at 6:30 PM in the nave with the liturgy of Maundy Thursday, which celebrates the events of the Last Supper, Jesus' washing of his disciples' feet, and the institution of the Eucharist. Poignantly, the Maundy Thursday liturgy also provides for the stripping of the altar and vestments in preparation for the Good Friday Liturgy. After the Maundy Thursday service, individuals will sign up to pray in the nave by shifts all night in a prayer vigil that will last until the Good Friday service at noon the next day. Then, on Friday (4/19), the liturgy for Good Friday powerfully commemorates the crucifixion of Christ. It includes prayers known as the "Solemn Collects." Later in the day at 5:30 PM, we gather together to pray the "Stations of the Cross." The "Triduum" is completed with Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday night (4/20) and then Easter Sunday (4/21) Morning services. These worship services are really two halves of the same whole. This year, the Great Vigil of Easter service will begin at 8:30 PM--just after dusk. We start in darkness, we kindle the new fire of Easter, then we proclaim that Easter has begun with light and loud "Alleluias!" Many find it to be one of the most striking and powerful liturgies they have ever attended. Then, of course, on Easter morning, we pick up again with the beautiful liturgy of Easter, continuing to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. We do this celebration of the resurrection as a church family in great style--we join together in a massive Easter Luncheon with an egg hunt for the kids!

This April, we have one more treat the week after Easter. Our Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Scott Mayer, will be coming for his annual visitation on Sunday April 28. The Bishop will Baptize and Confirm several members of our Church that day at the 10:30 service. Make sure to come greet our bishop and celebrate this important day in the lives of our fellow church members.

I invite you to make every effort to take advantage of participating in all of wonderful opportunities in the life of our parish in April and to enjoy the fullness of hope and inspiration that Christ has to offer all of us.

Reflections by Mother Jill

As we continue on our Lenten journey toward Holy Week and Easter, we talk about self-examination, sin, repentance, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Lent is not about some kind of self-imposed hardship or stoicism. It is actually about moving toward reconciliation with God, with ourselves, and with each other. And this reconciliation requires of us forgiveness, whether it is forgiveness we receive or forgiveness we give. It is the focus of our Lenten Devotionals this year in the Living Compass series. One of the ways we encounter forgiveness is in truly accepting God's forgiveness which means forgiving ourselves. I think this is sometimes one of the most difficult things we do. It's sometimes easier to believe that God might forgive us than to believe that we are truly 100% forgiven. And like most things in life, forgiveness is usually a marathon and not a sprint. Mildred Reyes reminds us that in forgiving ourselves, we must "be gentle, forgive yourself, and do not be afraid to wait." Isn't that true in forgiving ourselves and forgiving others? As we conclude this Lenten season, let's be gentle, forgive, and not afraid to wait on ourselves and each other.

Being Episcopalian: THE BASICS

Confirmation

Wait? You mean I'm already an Episcopalian!

At some point in our faith journey, we are expected to speak for ourselves before our community and claim our faith, our voice, and membership in the church. Confirmation is such a time. Choosing to be confirmed is an important milestone in the deepening of one's faith journey. The Episcopal church expects all people who are baptized at an early age to make a mature affirmation of faith and commitment to the promises made at baptism and receive the laying on of hands by a bishop.

Although our knowledge, beliefs, and experiences of God will change throughout our lives, discerning whether to be confirmed is a particular time of inquiry, prayer, exploration, and study. If we expect our young people to speak for themselves, we must allow them to do so- to seek and find their own faith and share the discovery with others. The time before confirmation is a time to ask "Who am I? What do I believe? At the same time, our beliefs do not appear out of thin air. They are the result of our tradition, culture, experiences, and the beliefs of our families and communities. Reflecting on these components makes the public affirmation of confirmation it all the more powerful. Each of these aspects are essential to a healthy spiritual life.

The 1979 Book of Common Prayer describes baptism as "full initiation" into the church. From the time of baptism we have been considered a part of the church. Confirmation is a public commitment to baptismal promises. Confirmation is Pastoral rite that publicly marks the mature affirmation of faith. Confirmation candidates reaffirm their renunciation of evil and renew their commitment to Jesus Christ. Confirmation is not a Rite of membership. That already took place at baptism. It does not make one an Episcopalian (or a Methodist or a Presbyterian). It is about the relationship between the candidate for confirmation and the Lord. Simply put, confirmation is one milestone on a continual and unending journey of faith.
